Senior National Team Selection (November 2018) – Montreal, Quebec

6 senior athletes (Kali Wong, Janelle Ball, Rebecca Harrower, Claudia Holzner, Audrey Joly, and Kenzie Priddell) attended Canada Artistic Swimming's Senior Fall Evaluation Camp in November 2018. Audrey Joly, Claudia Holzer, and Rebecca Harrower were all selected to the Canadian Senior National Team where they began full-time training at the Centre of Excellence in Montreal in January 2019. Kenzie Priddell was selected to the "Development Pool" and continued to train with the club until the end of the season. She was called up to join the full time training group in May. Janelle Ball and Kali Wong were not selected to the team and decided to retire following the results of the selection.

PROVINCIAL & NATIONAL TEAMS:

13-15:

- Genevieve Lefebvre & Noémie Girard were selected to the Quebec Provincial 13-15 Team. Competed at the SYNC competition in Gatineau in July. The team placed 2nd.
- Based on a CAS talent identification program that had been in place throughout the season; Tara Goettisheim, Mya Fortin, and Ève Berthiaume were invited to participate in the Canada Artistic Swimming 13-15 Selection Camp in Montreal in June, 2019. Following a week-long selection process, Tara Goettisheim and Mya Fortin were selected to the team. The team represented Canada at the first ever FINA Youth World Championships in Samourin, Slovakia in August, 2019. Tara Goettisheim and Mya Fortin were

also selected to represent the country in the duet event. The team placed 12th, and the duet placed 11th at the competition.

- Sabrina Roussel and Peter Crochetière were selected as Canada's first ever 13-15 mixed duet to compete for Canada at the FINA Youth World Championships in Samourin, Slovakia. The duet placed 7th. Katie MacLeod attended the competition as their coach. She also had the opportunity to stay after the competition to attend the FINA coach/judge conference, which proved to be an enriching professional development experience.

JUNIOR:

- Following a selection process which began in May 2018 and ended in October 2018; Claudia Janvier, Audrey Veilleux, and Mikaëlle Gauthier were all selected to represent Quebec at the 2019 Canada Games in Red Deer, Alberta. Audrey Veilleux and Mikaëlle Gauthier were selected to represent the team in both tech and free duet events, and Claudia Janvier and Mikaëlle Gauthier were selected as the province's two soloists. Laura Swift was selected as the assistant coach. The team placed 2nd in all events (solo, duet, and team) at the Canada Games in February 2019.
- In June 2019, Claudia Janvier, Mikaëlle Gauthier, and Audrey Veilleux were all selected to Quebec's Junior Provincial team who represented Quebec at the UANA Junior PanAmerican Championships in Windsor, Ontario (August 2019). Laura Swift was selected as the assistant coach.
